Joe Green attended a meeting recently in regards to our Public Liability Insurance, a report about this meeting will be given at our next general meeting (see article further on in this newsletter).



Conditional Registration for Historic Vehicles

Well at long last our 1973 Leyland P76 Vehicles are now eligible for Conditional Registration with the R.T.A. Over the holiday break in January I decided to register my Crystal White V8 Executive under the scheme. The car has been unregistered and in storage for at least the last 8 years and has only traveled about 15,000 kms.

All I did was check the car out for all the usual points i.e. make sure no oil leaks, no rust, lights, blinkers, wipers, horn etc working, seat belts, tyres, suspension, brakes all working. When starting the car for the first time after it has not been started for ages, you may have to prime the oil pump (this car did not need priming and started quickly).

When you are sure the car is OK, take it to your nearest garage and obtain a pink slip (a blue slip is NOT required) then fill in the form provided by the R.T.A. Make sure you answer all the questions and you must fill in the details of the pink slip and the report number. This form must then be signed by an official of our club (President, Secretary, Treasurer)

To confirm to the R.T.A. that you are a financial member of a recognized historic car club you must have proof of membership and proof of ownership of the vehicle (VIN Chassis or Serial No.) and proof of your own identity. Then take the papers to the R.T.A. and pay the fees, the initial cost including your new plates is \$84.00. You cannot choose the number plate, you are given whatever is on top of the pile.

Conditional Registration for Historic Vehicles...contd

There are certain rules which must be strictly adhered to and they are as follows:

- 1. Vehicles must be as close to original condition as possible with no alterations except for safety features.
- 2. You cannot use the vehicle for everyday use.
- 3. The vehicle may be driven to all authorized runs or events that our club lists in our magazine and it is advisable if you attend any run to take along our magazine with the details of the run.
- 4. The vehicle may be driven from a local repair shop within a reasonable distance, to carry out repairs. If you require to drive the vehicle any considerable distance from your home you must receive permission from your club in writing.

I had no trouble in obtaining my Historic Conditional Rego and my new number plate is 29729H. I now hope to take the Executive on the C.M.C.'s outing to Botany Bay on 23rd Feb.

Public Liability Insurance Problems

A couple of weeks ago the President of the A.N.S.M.A (Aust National Street Machine Association) Inc, Graham Stubbs, contacted me and asked me if possible to attend an important meeting that was to be held on Sunday 19th January 2003 in regards to problems with Public Liability Insurance. I agreed to attend the meeting. (Our club and many other Car Clubs that are traditional car clubs have their policies with the ANSMA Inc because the cost is very reasonable).

Now the problem that has arisen is that the insurers, QBE, have increased the cost of the policy from \$32,000 to \$75,000. As it stands at the present time all of the affiliated clubs are covered up to August 2003. When our policy is due to be paid in 2003, the cost will rise substantially and will be approximately \$17 to \$20 per member, it is currently \$8 per member.

In an effort to reduce these costs to our clubs and the other clubs the ANSMA has organized a giant raffle for a brand new Ford motor car, from Peter Warren Ford, to the value of \$16,000, or, this sum of money may be deducted from the purchase of any other car.

The cost of the tickets will be \$5 each and books of tickets will be sent out to all clubs, so when we receive the tickets it would be much appreciated if as many members as possible could buy tickets, or take a book of tickets and try to sell to their friends or relatives. If this raffle is successful our insurance will not increase.

However I would like to point out now that our normal club fees could rise in June 2003 as costs of running any club is rising rapidly and many other club Presidents spoke about this problem at the meeting where they stated that their club fees would have to increase.

Also, at the meeting I brought up the question of Conditional Registration for modified cars and the possibility that it could applied for as 'modified vehicles' of 30 years and over and this was agreed to. An application to the RTA by the ANSMA will be forwarded on in the near future.

At our next General Meeting I will be happy to answer any questions the members may wish to ask.


