

P76 NATIONALS IN GEELONG EASTER WEEKEND 2008

As part of the planning for the National P76 Meeting in Geelong, we serviced the P76 V8 Executive by checking the front brake pads, the rear brake linings, changing the oil and filter and giving the engine a tune. We decided to change the brake fluid and during the bleeding process, found the front brakes were sucking in air. The only thing to do was to overhaul the brake master cylinder. My records indicated that it had not been done for 20 years!!

On dismantling the master cylinder, I was amazed that the brake cups were in such good condition. The fault was found to be in the differential valve, which had partly seized in the innermost position, allowing air to enter the front hydraulic brake circuit. A new kit was installed, the master cylinder refitted and the brakes bled. As the car still has the original windscreen, we fitted the mesh windscreen protector for peace of mind.

With the car loaded and packed, we set off on Holy Thursday morning at 6am. Tony drove for the first part, handing over to Kay after a few hours. Kay then drove through Gundagai where we refuelled for the first time and then into Victoria. We continued sharing the driving with a second fuel stop at Seymour in Victoria and then encountering peak hour traffic on the outskirts of Melbourne, arriving at the Caravan Park in Geelong at 6.30pm.

The journey took 12.5 hours including stops and we thought it was a good effort for our P76. The weather was cool, however the barbie was warm and most appreciated after the travel. It was good to catch up with many friends from all over Australia.

Good Friday's plan was interrupted with some unexpected repair work on a couple of the cars, with many "experts" lending a hand. The owner of the Caravan Park volunteered to open his "shed" at the rear of the Park. Lo and behold we were treated to a wonderful display of eight American convertibles, which are part of his collection and included some very interesting memorabilia such as a Golden Fleece petrol bowser which doubled as a fridge!

Fish and chips were the order of the day on Friday evening, however being Good Friday the fish shop was overworked and the dinner was a bit late.

The weather warmed up from Saturday onwards and we gathered on the foreshore at Eastern Beach for the Concours Event. The display of P76's at this venue was spectacular. During the afternoon we visited some antique stores with Joe Green and Tony was lucky enough to purchase a 1930's penny for his collection. (Unfortunately it was only a replica!)

Saturday night dinner was booked at Smorgy's on Cunningham Pier. We all gathered for a buffet under a beautiful moonlit night and everyone had lots of fun.

Early Sunday morning we made our way north to Lara where Martin and Sylvia Hayes hosted a brunch at their home, including a monster parts sale and exchange, after which we competed in an Observation Run south again to Queenscliff on the Bellarine Peninsular. This was a lot of fun and Queenscliff is certainly a pretty place. Unfortunately NSW didn't win the event. The Delegate Meeting was held and it was decided that NSW would host the next Nationals in 2010.

The Dinner arranged on the Sunday evening at the Belmont RSL was a great evening, enjoyed by all with presentation to the winners of Concours, Trivia and those that participated in the auction. The Interstate Clubs congratulated Victoria for holding a well organised, memorable National Meeting for 2008 – a JOB WELL DONE.

On Monday most visitors headed to their respective homes but we decided to stay on and returned to Queenscliff where we took the vehicular ferry to Sorrento (as passengers without the car). The boat trip was very pleasant and well worth doing. Sorrento is a pretty place and neither of us had ever been there. We would like to one day revisit the Mornington Peninsular to make further discoveries.

That night we met up with the only P76 travellers left, Geoff & Christine Cutting from SA and enjoyed dinner with them once again at Belmont RSL.

Tuesday morning we set off for Melbourne to meet up with some of Tony's cousins, spending the day with them before heading for home at around 5pm.

We got to Wangaratta at around 8.30pm and decided it was time to find a bed for the night. Next morning we left at 8am making our first stop at Holbrook (the submarine town). Tony was most impressed with the display and museum of HMAS Otway and spent about an hour wandering around the town. It was a most interesting stop on our return journey.

The Dog on the Tuckerbox beckoned, so we stopped to say g'day – gee he's been there a long time (since 1932). It's always been an attraction on all the journeys south on the Hume Highway to stop and see the Dog.

Domestic strife took over with P76 Executive almost out of petrol and Kay said we should fill up at the Caltex service centre on the outskirts of Yass. But Tony said no, there would be a Shell service centre coming up soon and we'd fill up there!! BIG MISTAKE – so we thought we'd better take the next signposted exit to Yass, which had us driving back through the town and back to the Caltex service centre (almost 30 minutes later). Lucky there was still a sniff of petrol in the tank!!

On the road again and heading for home – we had a 3 o'clock lunch at Sutton Forest – MacDonalds – filled the car with petrol and arrived home at 6pm.

After travelling in excess of 2,200 kms the V8 Executive behaved extremely well. We are both of the opinion the P76 vehicle is a great touring car even by today's standards. We could not have expected any vehicle to perform as well as our car did.

We had a most enjoyable trip to the Nationals and thank the Victorian P76 Owners Club for all their hard work and organisation and look forward to NSW hosting the 2010 event.

- Four speed floor shift with heavy duty clutch (six new spare clutch plates)
- Ported and polished .020 over-bored balanced V8 engine
- · Electric hi-flow fuel pump
- Electronic ignition
- Baffled sump
- Electric tacho and oil pressure gauge
- Modified 350 Holley
- Budgie extractors in stainless
- Stainless, side-by-side twin exhaust
- Front suspension mods include:
 - Modified towers to reduce camber
 - Lowered springs
 - · Solid link, heavy-duty sway bar
- Rear end:
 - Lowered springs
 - · Rear sway bar
 - HD shocks
 - Rose jointed anti-tramp radius arms
 - Limited slip diff
- Wheels and tyres
 - Has a new set of street slicks on Bathurst Globe mags (cost \$1K)
 - Spare steel rims with stuffed Sumitomo racing tyres
- Fire extinguisher

The car was very competitive in the two seasons that it was running Historics in Queensland and was on the verge of really doing well in my third season when the red mist took over on the first corner at Leyburn. The damage to the passenger's front corner has been repaired but needs repainting. The whole car now looks a little shabby as it has sat in the shed for two years.




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
