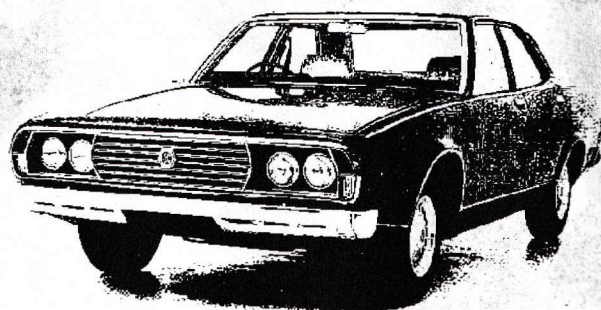

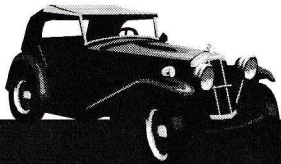

33rd Berrima Rally 2008

This weekend rally in the Southern Highlands was one of the most successful in the district, and has survived this length of time due to the clubs dedicated committee over these years (some of the committee members were on the committee when the club first began). We have attended this outing on and off since the mid 1980's.

Sue and I left Sydney on the Saturday morning at about 8am in the Force 7, the weather was great and we decided to go south along the highway and turn off at Bulli to Appin as this drive is much more picturesque than the motorway. The catchment area for the dam is very nice and motoring through all of the hairpin bends and steep inclines makes the trip much more interesting. We eventually ended up back on the Hume Highway just past Picton and about 30klms from Mittagong.

We arrived at the venue which is now the Mittagong Public School at about 9.45am there was a static show and shine held in the grounds where tea, coffee and scones were provided by the host club. Brian and Helen Maddaford were there in a very original executive P76. A bit later Peter and Pauline O'Brien arrived in their immaculate country cream deluxe. Between 12pm and 1pm lunch was held in the school canteen, some of the vehicles on display included, Ford Mustangs, Morris Minors, Chryslers, Dodge's, Morris Cowley, Ford Falcon's, Triumph, Jaguar, Holden, Monaro's, Minis and many others about 120 in total.

After lunch all of the cars assembled for a low key rally, our first stop was the site of Australia's 1st iron works and mines museum of which was uncovered recently when the firm of Woolworths was excavating the site for a new super center. The firm spent 2 million dollars to preserve what remained. It commenced in 1848 and was named Fitzroy Iron Works set on 100 acres in the underground car park of Woolworths and has great signage and information available.

We then continued on a leisurely drive along the back roads of the Southern Highlands and passed Mittagong Historic Air Strip and stopped at the Alpine Berry Farm. A very nice property, after purchasing various items we moved on then to a model railway museum. Some of the group continued onto the Bradman Museum at Bowral and also the local winery.

We then went to our motel at the Mittagong RSL, after freshening up we then all met up at the dinner dance at the RSL. The theme this year was Australiana. It was well supported and the crowd was great, the activities finished about 12pm.

The next morning we all left Mittagong RSL car park at about 9:30am for a scenic drive to Fitzroy Falls for a morning tea, again provided by the host club. After much chatting and car talk to many of the members of the other clubs we then went back to the RSL for a luncheon and presentation of trophies.

The luncheon again was first class and more food than you could eat. The trophies were then presented. We then said our goodbyes to all and proceeded home along the Hume Highway and then the Motorway arriving home at about 5:30pm on the Sunday after a great weekend with people from all walks of life and who have interests in all types of classic veteran and vintage cars. And yes we will be there again next year.

We then went back to the park at about 12pm and spent many more hours chatting etc to our friends and also many new ones as some were leaving very early in the morning.

On Monday morning March 24th Troy and I were up bright and early all packed up. Jason drove the West Australians to the airport. When he arrived back we had a quick breakfast at the café. After saying thanks and goodbye to Rick and his members we were ready to leave Geelong. Troy and I were driving Jason's white executive back to Sydney. Troy was driving, we were the last to leave behind Denise and Greg in their Country Cream P76, Jason in his Hairy Lime, Neville in his Nutmeg Targa and Steve Maher was in the lead car.

We left the park at about 10:30am, topped up with fuel and moved on. As we were the last ones in the group it was hard to keep up due to heavy traffic. We were soon out on the open road and had lost sight of the others, so we continued towards Sydney driving at just on the speed limit. We were on the road for some hours when the weather turned very bad, heavy rain and storms, while driving through this we noticed many dead kangaroos (about 12) on the side of the road, also a very large wombat this was as we were approaching Wangaratta. We then stopped in the township at the golden arches and had a quick snack.

We left Wangaratta at about 1pm, it was still raining heavily, however it soon stopped. We then turned off at Goulbourn topped up the tank (you would not believe it \$76 and this is true). We went next door to Maccas and after a quick stop we were away again at about 5:30pm.

It was not long after that we passed Suttons Forest and Mittagong, then one of my friends rang me to tell me about the traffic problems and hold-ups coming into Sydney. He said there was about a 6km line of cars at Wollongong and the traffic on the M5 was at a standstill. So we decided to turn off the highway at the Picton branch and go through Wilton and Appin oast the catchment and dam area and came out on the highway at Bulli. This was good in theory, however it was now night time, very dark, no street lights and the rain was on again.

So we left the highway towards Wilton, we then received a phone call from Jason "How are you going? Where are you? Is my P76 OK?" We pulled over to the side of the road and Troy replied "everything is great except for the rain, where are you Jason?" He said they were at Maccas at Sutton Forrest, we explained to him we where we were and assured him his car had not missed a beat. So we were off again.

Anyhow upon moving, the heavy rain began again and also there were light hail stones, not good. Continuing down the mountain side, near the catchment area of the dam and down the bridge through the tight hairpin bends. OOPS!!!! Lost it.....4 wheels slide around the bend and into the trees!!! Sorry Jason..... Just Joking!!!!

Anyhow it was very difficult driving in this area, the vision was very bad, road was greasy, the good thing was, next to no traffic, and we both know this road really well.
