The Austin Club continued with this display up until 1988 and then in 1989 The Association of British Car Clubs was formed to replace The Austin Motor Vehicle as coordinators of the Annual All British Display Days and to encourage the preservation of motor vehicles made in the U.K or in other countries by British manufacturers.

The club always raises many thousands of dollars for charity every year and it is generally The Arthritis Foundation of N.S.W. that is supports. I must congratulate the efforts of all the Committee Members and also the associated clubs. This Show has been held at many venues over the years and I began to attend them in the 1980's at Greens Motor Museum at Leppington. It has been held for the past few years at Kings School, Parramatta and I must say this has been the most successful venue. The event is, I believe, the best one of the year. It is a very family orientated show and the number of cars on show now is always about 1800, a vast contrast to when I attended at Greens Museum and the show cars on display ranged from 60 to 100 cars.

Both the Shannon's Eastern Creek Classic on Sunday 19th August and the All British Day at King College the following Sunday, were very enjoyable outings that I managed to get to.


We had a long trip back home but again the P76 ran fine. I think I was more tired than the car by the time I got home but we will do it all again next year,


