2013 LUNCHEON EVENT

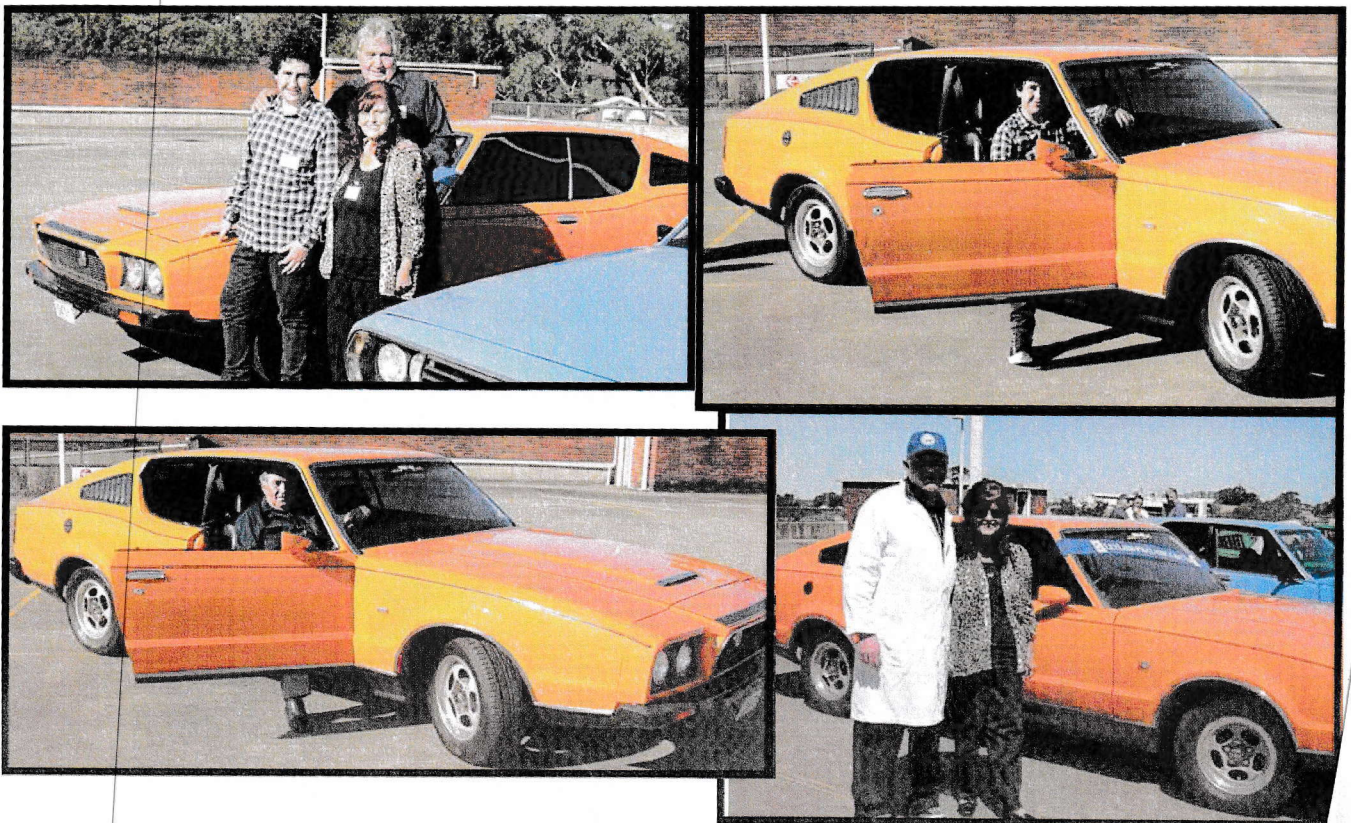

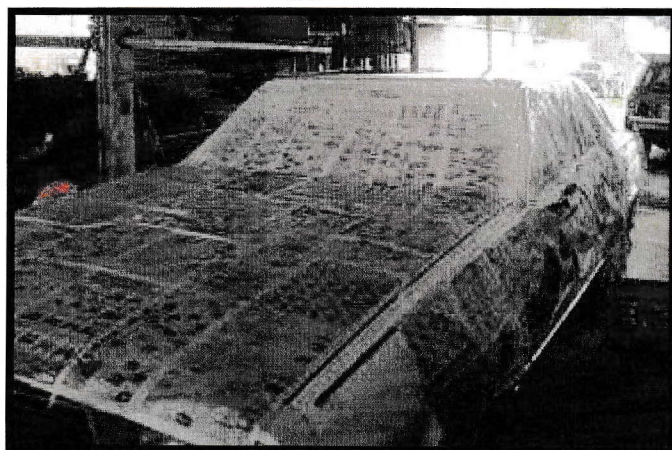


THE DON

As I worked 6 days a week it was put up the back of my block, funny how time goes by so slowly when you are doing nothing. My executive was still not ready in time for the 40 year celebrations in Canberra, so I had to resuscitate the 'Don Mobile'



After removing front and rear screens I found what some lazy panel beater has done in the way of repair, I had to stem the flow of water into the vehicle. See pictures of strips of metal pop rivets which was all that was left of the frame it was soldered and bogged over, so after redoing the front and rear windows I then had to repair the boot floor as water has a miraculous ability to find its way into any place so boot floor was next. Rear chassis rail, dog leg and some lovely rear quarter damage that had been bogged over.

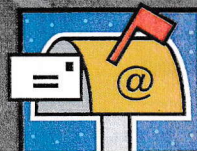
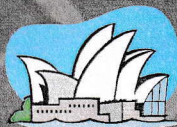
