Christmas 1973 we went to visit friends in Ferntree Gully. In the driveway was a brand new Leyland (white) P76 V/8 4 speed Super, not mad about its looks (compared to my 12 month old Charger also white) but I had not seen one up close before. I was giving it the once over when Ronas, our friend said "take it for a run..." not needing to be told twice, I was off. I was impressed, nice power, nice ride, nice and quiet, nice everything, the overall look I was not sure about. She had it for years and loved it, the look grew on me in the end.

Fast Forward to June 22nd 2003 I went to the newsagent 8:30am, the current Just Cars came out that morning, browsing while sitting in the car I came across Leyland P76 Targa Florio in Adelaide. On the mobile straight away, after a quick chat I said "I would take it and I would ring back with pick up details" Lunchtime my phone rang, the guy with the Targa, "if you want this car you better send me some money the phone is going mad" \$500 into his bank and a phone call to Virgin Airlines for a flight to Adelaide next morning. Up early, train to Melbourne (we are 2hrs East of Melbourne) bus to the airport, plane to Adelaide, taxi to meet up with the owner, William O'Brien and his son, paid over the balance and after lunch by now filled up with fuel, depart South Rd 3:30pm. The plan is to stay in a motel around about Horsham (half way). When I got there I had Macca's for tea and looked for a motel? I feel good, car running like a Swiss watch, I'll go a bit further, Ballarat 10:30pm still feel good, car superb, not stopping now, 1:30 am I pulled into my drive at home. I stepped out of that car and felt like I had just driven from down the road, quiet smooth and comfortable, 10 hours in a strange car with no complaints!!

My wife thought I was stopping somewhere so when she heard me she freaked out, she was convinced the burglars were in. I was in trouble, driving late at night in an unfamiliar car was not on.




