



Great Memories 1st National Meeting Morpeth Easter 1984

This was the first major Leyland P76 meeting ever held and was organised by the Hunter Valley P76 club. Their club was very game and ambitious, however their gamble paid off and I believe it was one of the most successful National meetings ever held to date.

Sue and I decided to attend this meeting and take our children along. At this point of time Richard and Troy were still at school. I spent the week prior to the event attending my normal work in the building trade and spent most nights tidying; polishing and detailing my crystal white executive P76 V8. This car was in very good original condition and low mileage then and it still is.

We were not able to leave until early on Good Friday morning, unfortunately the weather was very bleak and raining heavily and the road conditions were terrible, so all the long hours I had spent washing, polishing and detailing the car were lost. The trip to Morpeth in the Hunter Valley was very slow and tedious in the constant rain. However I think the rain eased up when we arrived at the historic township of Morpeth.

The venue was being held at the St James Church Morpeth. The church had an amenities and accommodation block including a kitchen and dining room for the visitors, and a very large grassed area that was ideal for parking or displaying our cars.

Upon our arrival we were very warmly greeted by Wal and Jessie Wells, Hall and Faye Maloney, Jim Farmer and many others of the Hunter Valley committee members. Our kids were very excited to see so many cars the same as ours all together in one place. After registration we unpacked the car and Sue organised our room. I decided I would have to give the car a really good wash and clean up.

There was a hive of activity in the grounds as the entrants were arriving thick and fast and it was like an army camp as some members were setting up tents. After lunch a member of the local historical society organised a walk for all of us around the historic Morpeth Village, and it was most interesting.

Church services were held during the whole of the weekend and the host club organised a nice evening of fish and BBQ, it was great, we then adjourned to the large library hall in the church grounds and some interesting talks were given by Wall Wells the Hunter Valley president, Hal Maloney, Joe Torony, Alan Baker and then a very informative talk about the 1954 all round Australia Redex reliability trial by Ken Tubman who won this inaugural event in a Peugeot 203, he had the audience captured. We were then able to socialise and get to know the members from interstate.

On the Saturday morning we were all up bright and early and had a nice breakfast in the dining hall. An observation run was organised by Hal Moloney and Jim Farmer and we all left the venue at about 8:00am to 8:30am and the run was very interesting as it went through the Hunter region and finished at Dungog.

We then ventured on to the MG car clubs dirt circuit situated at Nelson Plains and had another nice BBQ lunch and then the competition began and was it fierce!!! It was so exciting and children were so impressed and through it was great entertainment the hard, aggressive driving of Hal, Jim, Wal, Joe and Roland Torony, Geoff Jago and Barbara Dela Hunty had to be seen to be believed. I did manage to get a few good photos of this event.

This finished late on Saturday afternoon so we then went back to the church grounds and cleaned up our cars once again (the rain had gone) for the concourse event.

The line up of so many P76's on this lovely grassed area was very impressive. After the judging we then cleaned up ourselves for the Saturday night dinner dance at the hall. This went off very well, the room was great and the raffle prizes were drawn and then the president, Wal Wells, awarded the trophy's for the concours.

I was very surprised as we won a trophy for the most original P76 and Wally Howard in his Targa was the runner up. Richard Harris won the modified section and Graham Rogerson won the award for the best Targa.

Wow!!! This was such a full day.

The next day, Sunday, was a much quieter one. Church services in the morning and then free time to lunch time. We then all drove in convoy to Toronto and Lake Macquarie to go on a river cruise on the Wangee Queen, so after parking our P76's in the car park we all walked along the causeway to board the boat and to our surprise someone yelled out "a P76 has crashed in the river" we all looked down to the water and to our amazement there was a Spanish Olive P76 cruising up the river, driven by Hal Moloney and Jim Farmer, it was a body shell that had a small outboard motor mount on the rear and had 5 gallon drums fitted and welded under the guards for buoyancy. This was an outstanding sight and was applauded by all. Full marks to Hal and Jim for this bright idea.

We then all proceeded to the Wangee Queen and had a delightful cruise. After the cruise finished we then went to the local RSL Club where we had been booked in for an evening meal. This was another very nice way to finish the day.

The Monday morning was very quiet we all had a farewell break feast in the dining hall then packed up our bags and the members who had tents set up were very busy dismantling them and tidying up.

Well that's about it we had a nice drive home and we travelled in convoy with Pat Howard and the late Wally Howard, in their Targa and two other Victorians whose name I can't remember.

Anyhow I think I have most of the facts right, it was a long time ago, 26 years to be precise. Sue, I and family were very impressed by the way the Hunter Valley club organised this 1st National meeting and I would like to congratulate all of them, it was a great team effort and I am sure that this 2010 National at Motto Farm in the Hunter Valley will be as successful as that in 1984.

Well that's it for me and I hope you have not been bored by my rambling memories. I hope to see you all at Motto Farm, Easter 2010.
