Vehicle condition:

This car has been re-built from the ground up. All rust has been removed professionally and finished with 2/pak paint. All channels, ceils, chassis rails and crevices have been fully rust proofed. New carpet and Upholstery throughout car (Stylish Red and Charcoal fabric). New old stock has been used throughout the car. (e.g. Headlight, wiper switches and windscreen wiper motor). The stereo is BRAND NEW (as most things are in this car) with Kenwood Head unit - 3RCA Cables. Speakers front - 150watt splits (Pioneer) Rear - 500watts 5 Ways (Pioneer). All speakers connected to 500 watt Kenwood Amp, in the boot are two 12" Subs which are connected to 1000watt Amp... Oh yeah and a six stack Kenwood!

Motor:

Motor has been re-built a number of years ago which overall has clocked up approx. 50,000KM since rebuilt. Motor has been fitted with 253 Holden Pistons, Slight Cam, 4 Barrel Manifold (Willpower performance), 465 Holley, Valiant Electronic Ignition, Distributor (Fitted with Orange box, not original black box). Re-conditioned starter motor, re-conditioned water-pump. There is also a brand new Carter Electric fuel pump with Holley pressure gauge. Motor is fitted with extractors with collectors, that you can unbolt the pipes and fit 2.5" stainless steel side pipes. The heads have been shaved a little and ported and polished. There has been a new three-core radiator fitted, with new hoses. There is also a brand new battery, battery leads and clamps.

Motor was built to be an everyday driver and it has proven to be a strong reliable motor.

Suspension:

Rear end has not had a lot of work, besides wheel bearings. Front End has had two new front struts and hardened springs (Lowered 2.5"), new topstrut mount bushes. New lower control arm bushes. New ball joints. New tie-rod ends and boots. New discs fitted. New wheel bearings. Thick front sway bar The front end has all new polyurethane bushes. Front calipers have been re-

conditioned and fitted with new brake pads. While we're on brakes, there has been a new master cylinder fitted to a re-conditioned brake booster.

Mags and Tyres:

Front wheels: Dragway superspokes, $8" \times 14"$ fitted with 245-50-14 (Front spacer plates are fitted) Rear: Dragway superspokes, $9" \times 14"$ fitted with 265-50-14 (No spacers required). Tyres are Bridgestone Eagers and have quite good tread.

Other Details:

Electricals have been checked by professionals. Things added such as: Starter relay, and new old stock fuse box. Brand new front windscreen was fitted in the re-built. Brand new tail-shaft was made for this car a couple of years ago. Steering wheel is not original, although it has been fitted with a \$500 Isotta Wheel (Red and Silver). After market temp gauge has been used, Valiant taco has been fitted.

Also as you can see in the photos the boot has also been professionally boxed off, with toolbox under floor of boot. And other spare compartments.

Sent: Sunday, December 16, 2007 8:49:05 AM Subject: [215V8] Post 3.5 motor blocks There has been a lot of questions on the high incidence of loose liners on LR engines after the 3.5. At the end, it was happening enough to abandon the engine for main line production. I have heard some very weird theories over the years...none true. Though there were many improvements to the engine and the block over the LR/Rover years, one modification turned out to be a sad one. When the block went from the original 3.5 (215 ci) to 3.9, the bore went from 88.9 to 94mm. After that, all later bore sizes become 94mm for the 4.2, the 4.0 and the 4.6s. In making the bore wider, the space between the cylinders was greatly reduced. In an effort to compensate, the coolant passages between the cylinders was thinned and shortened in hope of bolstering the structure between. The result was a weaker heat point, more sensitive to heat effect and expansion. As the years went on, the fuel mixtures became thinner to meet ever stricter emission regulations and the power was pushed higher. Ergo even more heat. Additionally, the molds grew old and the placement of the coolant passages at the key point uncertain. By the 4.0/4.6 era, cracked blocks and loose liners became common. Problems from over boring and race modifications were/are epidemic especially with the heavy high load LRs. The very newest block, redesigned this year and made by Coscast rectifies the problem. However, they are still very rare and very expensive. I will try to post a picture of a cut open 4.0/4.6 showing the water passage between the cylinders. Note the remaining casting between the shortened water passage and the liner. (1mm) I will also post a picture of the new Coscast for comparison. They will be hopefully under an album called James Bartell under "Photos" at the right. James P.S. The problem crop up with a frequency determined by the weight of the vehicle, the mileage of the block and the thinness of the fuel mixture. Blocks in lighter cars running richer seem to survive

Subject: New Legislation <u>M5 & M7 Re Speeding Fines</u>

<u>M5 and the M7</u> are now equipped with Point to Point speed devices. Once you enter the M7 for instance you pass the etag and it beeps. At the same time a camera takes a photo of your car and records the exact time.

For those who have exited the M7 they would be aware that upon exit the e tag system beeps again as you leave.

At the same time another camera at that point takes a photo of the car and the time. Then the computer calculates the time it has taken you to travel between the two points and calculates your speed.

If you have completed the clocked journey too fast you are given a speeding ticket. At the present time the speed limit is 100K.P.H. and you have a tolerance of 102 and no more. One fraction over that speed and you are issued with a fine automatically. Remember, this is going to be a very costly experience for some drivers.

It is also going to mean vehicles will be travelling at 95 in order to ensure that no ticket is issued. What a shock some drivers are going to have when they have used this roadway for a week and get a weeks tickets BOTH WAYS.

Of course your license will also be recalled for three months and you know the rest. Take the advice and if you ignore it remember this email when you pay all those fines.

Also, remember that now with the new legislation, fighting a speed camera fine is almost impossible. You must prove the device is faulty and if you are not a technician working on them, you have no chance of beating the fine. The Pacific Highway has a set and these are recognized as large steel frames over the lanes with a speed camera and some distance up the road is another large metal frame with a speed camera. These new point to point systems are being put onto any expressway or highway where vehicles are not able to exit between those points. Also remember that school zone cameras are not speed tolerant. Anything over, even 41, is a fine. This means people will be doing 38 to avoid any differences in their speedo readings.
