## LEYLAND P76 OWNERS NATIONAL BODY

In the last issue of The Leyland Post I had included a Discussion Paper on a proposed National Body comprising all the Leyland P76 Car Clubs in Australia and possibly New Zealand. Since that Discussion Paper was published I have had many discussions with Leyland P76 Club members from all over Australia. Generally the response has been a favourable one.

After getting the good feedback I decided to put together a more formalised document outlining the objects and structure of the National Body. The new document is called a Charter and after consultation with others we have come up with the working title of "Council of Leyland P76 Clubs". The draft Charter is about 3 pages long so I won't reprint it here but the Objects of the "Council" are listed here.

### 3. OBJECTS

- a. To assist in the promotion of the Leyland P76, Force 7 and Marina vehicles and the member clubs of this body.
- b. To act as an umbrella organization and to foster a better relationship between the existing Leyland based car clubs.
- c. To co-ordinate the re-manufacture of parts.
- d. To source New Old Stock (NOS) parts and distribute to member clubs.
- e. To provide a common medium through which member clubs can exchange information easily.
- f. To assist member clubs with the allocation and organisation of National Meetings.
- g. To create a standardised set of Concours Regulations and Rules to be adopted at National Concours held in conjunction with the National Meeting and member clubs own individual concours events.
- h. To create and maintain a National Parts List, drawing information from existing clubs and alternative sources (businesses and enthusiasts). Thus making the sourcing of parts for P76, Force 7 and Marina owners much easier.
- i. To create and maintain a National Register and ensure the sharing of information in the National Register to member clubs.
- j. To create and maintain a continuing supply of "Certificates of Original Build".
- k. To seek better insurance cover for the Council's member clubs.
- 1. To be a non-profit organisation.

If you would like a complete copy of the draft Charter please drop me line or email and I will happily send you a copy. As I said this is a draft and not yet the final version so if you have anything that you would like changed, deleted or added don't hesitate to get in touch with me.

I am very happy that this club has given its support for this initiative and I'm also very happy to say that the W.A. Owners club is also in full support of the National Body. I feel sure that other clubs will also come on board in due course.

The Riverina Run Classic Rally was the first major event on the 2011 NSW Calender and was conducted over 2 days, March 5 and 6, starting and finishing in Goulburn. Total distance for the event was about 900kms covering some of the best southern inland country roads in NSW. 41 crews contested the event in 3 classes. 19 crews were in our class.

This was my second attempt at the Riverina Run having first run it in 2009 with Brian Madigan in his 1973 VW Beetle. This year I was asked to navigate for Ian Packard in his 1978 Peugeot 504. Although not big on horsepower, the Peugeot was at least comfortable, certainly more comfortable than the VW. The VW was also challenged in the hp department but it did stop and handle well. The Peugeot was like riding in a boat, albeit a fairly comfortable boat.

Saturday morning saw competing crews leave Goulburn around 8.30am and run the first 240km leg to lunch at Wallendbeen. It looked like half the town had turned up to check us out as lunch was organised to coincided with a Market Day at the local oval where the lunch stop was based. Checking out the cars parked around the oval saw everything from a 1960 Jaguar Mk2 to a 2009 Falcon XR8. Some of the local classic car owners brought their cars over to join in during lunch. My pick was a fantastic restored Austin A40. 3 crews had scored penalty points so far thankfully not including us so we were equal 1<sup>st</sup> with 15 other crews all with a clean sheet.

From Wallendbeen we wound our way over the second 260km leg to finish the day in Wagga Wagga. Dinner was at the RSL Club and it was with much anticipation that all the crews waited to check out the results to the halfway point. 500 odd kms into the event we were now down to 11 clean sheeters. It was obvious by this point that some form of tiebreaker was probably going to have to be put in place to separate the field at the end of the event, unless of course most of the clean sheeters made a mistake.

Sunday morning was, like Saturday, slightly overcast and not too hot. Perfect rally conditions. The morning leg was around 200kms to lunch at Binalong. Another 2 crews had scored penalty points on the morning run bringing the clean sheeters down to 9, including us. From here the pressure is really on as this was the last short 140km leg to the finish back at Goulburn. From here you could only lose the event, as there was a better than average chance that at least 1 crew would finish with 0 points lost.

The finish at Goulburn came up relatively quickly and Ian and I were pretty confident that we had cleaned the event. As predicted there was a tiebreaker at the finish. The 9 crews that were clean at lunch stayed that way to the end so the tiebreaker would determine all 3 top placegetters. Drive you car as close to a witch's hat without touching it, sound familiar! Sadly this was where our rally fell to bits. We finished 9<sup>th</sup> after the tiebreaker with a clean sheet for the event with 0 points lost. In 2009 Brian and I finished 2<sup>nd</sup> after the tiebreaker also with a clean sheet. Still that's motor sport and despite the end result Ian and I had a great weekend with some great people in some great classic cars. The top 3 in our class were a 1976 Porsche 911, a 1995 Porsche 928 GTS and a 1968 MGC GT. We will be back to do it again.

# WINGS OVER ILLAWARRA ALBION PARK AIRFIELD - SUNDAY 27TH FEBRUARY 2011

Tony and I headed off just after 7am with our next door neighbour, whose husband is a member of the Historic Aircraft Restoration Society (HARS) the organization responsible for the Air Show. The journey took just over 90 minutes but delays at the destination added a further 30 minutes (cars had to be registered at the Showground then follow in convoy to the rear entrance of the airfield).

This meant that the classic car display was in a different area to previous years, close to the beginning of the runway which gave us an outstanding view of aircraft taking off.

We went for a walk around the hangers and displays of aircraft – well worth a look for those conversant with historic aircraft. For those like me, it's just looking at the different shapes, sizes and whether they've got propellers or not. An interesting exhibit was the replica fuselage of Sir Charles Kingsford Smith's Southern Cross.

The flyovers were absolutely great – the WW2 Spitfire fighter (pictured), paragliders manoeuvring around above us and all types of aircraft, large and small were taking off and landing all through the day, including the Super Constellation (Connie), which has been lovingly restored by HARS. Unfortunately the Roulettes couldn't attend, due to technical difficulties.

It's fun for the kids (and parents too I suppose) to be able to get onboard the helicopters and planes and imagine yourself taking off and soaring over the rooftops, pretending you're the pilot or whatever.

The car display was huge and attracted a wide range of classic vehicles. This year there was a "parade area" where the Clubs could show individual vehicles and talk about each ones history and specifications etc.

A great crowd was in attendance, enjoying the additional kids activities and food outlets. The day was an outstanding success for the organisers and a lot of fun for those who attended.

We arrived back home at West Pennant Hills around 5pm.

<u>General Business:</u> Kay & Tony reported on CMC news – Forum on HCRS issues to be held in June (date/ venue to be advised). There was further discussion on Registration costs in NSW and sharp increase in Green Slips.

> Steve tabled his Discussion Paper and spoke about the possibility of having a National Body, post the Nationals Meeting in April 2010. The database issue came up at the Nationals between WA & Vic. The State Clubs would be affiliates of the National Body and the Clubs would therefore be regarded as owners of the database. Mark Ellery spoke about the Thunderbird Club, of which he is a Member. There is a National Thunderbird Body in Australia (Australia-wide). He is going to put together a report on how the Thunderbird organization works and we can use this as a guide. Mark said there are members in each State, Melbourne being the first Club set up and other States followed the same setup format. Insurance is organized on a National level and magazines are processed on a National level. There is National Sponsorship including Shannons and there is a National Website, an annual Concours and AGM. Each State can have the authority to hold a National Concours event. Currently there are approx. 140 members Nationally.

Steve felt that the National Body would be able to assist in the organization of the P76 Nationals. Public Risk Insurance is another area where a National Body could attract a better deal. Concours rules need to be co-ordinated. Steve requested each Member read and give feedback on the Discussion Paper.

Discussion took place about the World Cup Rally Car Model and it was decided to set a price of \$195.00 each for the Model – cost price \$165.00. Moved: Mark Ellery Seconded: Glenn Gray

Brian Hooper advised that millet seed would be harvested at the farm in the next 2-3 weeks and after that the Club should have a bonfire weekend at Oberon.



#### General Business:

Tony De Luca reported on CMC news – Forum on HCRS issues to be held on 15th June 2011 at the Western Suburbs AFL Club, 40Hampton St, Croydon Park, commencing at 7.30pm. Every-one welcome, particularly Club Registrars.

Steve spoke about some progress being made in relation to the National Body. See notes below:

#### Aims

To help promote in a positive light the P76 and Force 7 vehicles and member clubs; To help foster a better relationship between the existing P76 clubs;

To co-ordinate the re-manufacture of parts;

To source New Old Stock (NOS) parts, and the distribution of these to the existing clubs;

To only supplement the existing clubs, with never having the intention of replacing the clubs; If in the event of need, to help with the allocation National Meetings and organisation of such; The creation of standardised concourse regulations and rules, to be adopted at National Meet-

- ings and clubs own individual concourse events;
- To create and update a National parts list, drawing information from existing clubs and alternative sources (businesses and enthusiasts). Thus making the sourcing of parts for P76 owners much easier;
- The upkeep and promotion of the National Register, along with sharing the information from the National Register;

The creation and ongoing availability of vehicle authenticity certificates.

#### Structure

A delegate from each member club to create a committee;

- The committee to be made up of the following President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, Spare parts officer, national register officer;
- A committee member can hold more than one position at the same time. In the event that a committee position cannot be filled, a member club can put forward a person to fill the vacant position. This person though will have no voting rights, as only one delegate from each club has voting rights;
- If the National Body has 4 or fewer member clubs, the option of each member club having two delegates;

The committee would need to make the decision on the status of the body, whether it is to be an incorporated club, have an ABN and be a business, or just a loose organisation;

No individual can join the body.

#### Finance

Each member club to pay a yearly membership fee to the National Body; The possibility of having a once off membership application fee, to help create an initial fund.

#### Meetings/Communication

The committee to mainly communicate through email, with the possibility of a monthly or bimonthly meeting on Skype or similar internet based communication system;

A half yearly newsletter to communicate with clubs members on the activity of the National Body, with achievements along with future plans outlined;

Discussion took place about whether the Club should change the PO Box from Kingswood to Baulkham Hills, but it was decided not proceed with this.

Members were asked whether they would be attending Shannons Eastern Creek Classic in August 2011. It was decided to order 12 tickets at \$12.00 each.

Brian Hooper advised that there would be a Bonfire Night on the weekend of 9/10 April 2011 at Oberon.


