

It is with much sadness that we learnt recently of the passing of one of our long time members – Jim Reid. Jim passed away in

Hervey Bay; Qld whilst escaping the Syd-

ney Winter from health complications on 7th August aged 90. Jim was born in Scotland in 1920 and left school at 15 to work as an apprentice mechanic. As a member of the Army Reserve he joined the Regular Army at the outbreak of World War 2 where he served in France and was at Dunkirk. He married his wife, Agnes in 1942 and in the following years had 3 daughters, Margaret, Anne and Marilyn. Obviously not one for cold weather, Jim, his wife and three

daughters immigrated to Australia from Scotland in 1955 where he eventually settled in Blacktown where they were joined by a fourth daughter, Lesley. Jim's love of BMC/Leyland Aust products began with an Austin 1800, Austin Kimberley and finally his loved P76 Executive, which he bought in 1976. Despite a succession of other cars he never parted with his P76 loving it's comfort, roominess and power for towing the family caravan, claiming to his family "Only a mechanic could own a Leyland" and "It will be here till I die & then you can get rid of it".

Jim's Executive is now for sale for \$5000. It has the rare Casino Blue interior and is very tidy inside. The car drives like a dream with no rattles feels almost like a new car. SHANNONS EASTERN CREEK CLASSIC

2000 classic cars, including a few of Leyland's best, were part of the largest classic car event in the Southern Hemisphere, The 2011 Shannons Eastern Creek Classic. This event just gets bigger and bigger making near impossible to get around and see everything.

This annual event organised by the Council of Motor Clubs makes it possible to see, up close and personal, virtually everything in classic motoring in Australia. Everything from vintage buses to army vehicles to Messerschmitt micro cars were on show including a nice selection of Leyland P76s from both Sydney based clubs.

Tony and Kay De Luca were up to their neck in this event. Not only bringing 2 Crystal White cars, Tony's Executive press car and his 6cyl Deluxe, but they were also an integral part of organising and running this event. We didn't see much of them during the day but when we did they were usually rushing from one place to another. HISTORIC REGO NEWS

For all that know me - HI!

Those who don't I'm Shane the new Historic Registrar for our club I have been speaking to the RTA as to what is required for Historic Rego in NSW. A new system has been put in place so that we can manage our historic registration. There are no Major changes; more a new record keeping system and notes for all people with historic registered cars. These have had to be put in place so that we meet the RTA requirements. The only thing that I was told by the RTA was;

(1) All cars wishing to apply for historic rego must produce a current club membership card with MEMBERSHIP NUMBER on it.

(2) Even though it is only a club requirement that a pink slip be obtained for registering each year the Club must have a record of it if it's been asked by club.

Even I didn't know it so there you go.

As for the club side of it, I am putting a new record system in place for all cars on historic rego. We have set up a new EMAIL address **p76hrnsw@live.com.au** for all correspondence to go to regarding historic rego including vehicle movements. All movements not included in the Club Calendar for your cars MUST BE NOTIFIED to me via email. Please follow this up with a text message **0459292900** to let me know you have sent an email. The following details must be included. The only reason is if I'm contacted by Police or RTA I can say yes I know that car is on the road etc.

- (1) Dates of travel
- (2) Full name
- (3) Rego number
- (4) Reason for trip
- (5) Departure point and Destination
- (6) Start and finish kilometres/miles

BMC/LEYLAND AUSTRALIA HERITAGE GROUP LUNCHEON

The Heritage Group lunch was once again a resounding success despite the absolutely terrible weather. Although the weatherman had predicted showers, it rained heavily almost constantly all day. The bad weather had an obvious affect on the number of cars in the traditional carpark display. Expected number was around 28, this dwindled to about 14 on the day. The selection of cars on display was, as usual, wide and varied with P76s from Marty Stockwell (2), Glenn Gray, Tony and Kay De Luca (P76 and Austin Maxi) and Jason Birmingham (2). Non P76s included an impressive selection of Australian made BMC products and a few UK imports. Present from the land of P76 was of course those just mentioned plus Steve Maher, Drew Griffith, Noel Delforce, Adrian Spencer, Neville Humphries, Joe and Sue Green, Hal Moloney, Warrewyk Williams and a host of others including family and friends.

118 partook of lunch which was intermingled with guest speakers including Malcolm Mason, who was the Export Manager for Leyland Australia, Angela Williams, who produced a short P76 documentary and Tony De Luca with Con Van Wensveen, who spoke of their quality evaluation of the first Austin Tasman and Kimberley in 1971. This year marks the 40th Anniversary of the release of the Tasman/Kimberley range. Tony and Con were joined by Tom Warner and Jack James to road test and fault find all systems in the first Tasman and Kimberley off the production line. They covered nearly 4,000 miles in 8 days throughout Queensland and NSW proving the strength of the engineering of these 2 Australian designed vehicles. Much interest was in the upcoming release of the new book, produced by the Heritage Group, on the history of the Zetland manufacturing plant. Barry Anderson gave everyone an update on its progress with some sample pages to review. It will be a book worth buying when it is released. Adrian Spencer also gave a talk on the upcoming 2012 Leyland P76 Nationals. Our own Kay De Luca once again outdid herself organising a great day in her usual style.





Get your classic out of the shed and join fellow motoring enthusiasts on the two day 2011 Alpine Classic Rally. Running for the 13th year, the Alpine is the only timed navigational event in NSW and is considered one of the premier events on the Classic Rally Club's calendar. Set in the beautiful Central West of New South Wales, crews will have the opportunity to drive on some of the best roads this state has to offer.

Three categories of navigation will cater for all levels of skill. Those with experience and seeking a serious challenge will opt for Masters, whilst crews requiring a little more guidance will go for the Apprentices. For anyone just wanting a fabulous drive in the spring countryside without the challenge of navigation, the Tour category is ideal, although a small amount of mapping will be included.

The Alpine will start in Lithgow, at the foot of the Blue Mountains. The event will travel a circuitous route to the overnight stop in Orange, where competitors will have the opportunity to spend a relaxed evening with their newfound rally friends. Two motorkhanas, held over the lunch break will give those with a lead foot the chance to have some fun! After a good night's rest, it's on the road again for another day of Classic Rallying. It will then be on to the traditional pub finish near Lithgow.

The event is open to pre-1981 cars of any marque. Other cars will be considered on submission to the Event Secretary.

Included in the cost of \$429 for a crew of two will be breakfast at the start in Lithgow, two lunches, a sumptuous evening meal in Orange, motel accommodation and breakfast. Your rally pack will contain all maps needed for the event, windscreen banner and car number, rally romer (for new entrants), Alpine Classic caps and cloth badges. Alpine Classic polo shirts will also be available for purchase at a cost of \$30.

Cost for additional crew members or passengers is \$160 each.

The event will be strictly limited to 85 entrants, so get your name in early!

Entries close on Friday 17 September 2011.
