At this time there are currently 18 cars on historic registration in our club.

Strut order

Its is now time to get our strut order together

We have heard back from Pedders, the price of the struts will be \$300.00 per set incl GST. This of course may vary a little as we are buying in US Dollars and so now are subject to the variances of the money market. Any adjustments will be made and a refund or shortfall to be paid

Price is pickup from club meeting venue so freight may also need to be paid for delivery. The only unique part is the locking ring or gland nut that holds the cartridge in the strut tube. This will take the longest to engineer.

Remember minimum order is 100 pieces or 50 sets.

Lead time will be confirmed after we have placed the order as the tooling for the locking rings will not start until the order is placed but expect approx 8 - 12 weeks.

We need to get our numbers in ASAP This order will also be co-ordinated with the other P76 clubs Nationally via the National Council

It is important that if you require Struts either now or in the foreseeable future <u>Order</u> now as it could be two years between orders to get the quantities needed.
