

Tony and I had a most enjoyable trip to the UK doing a Trafalgar Coach Trip over 16 days, travelling from London through Stratford and north through Leeds to Edinburgh. A couple of nights in Edinburgh to see the city sights and then visit St Andrews before taking the high road to the Scottish Highlands. Snow on the peaks and beautiful scenery in every direction. We visited castles, watched sheep dog displays, cruised the Locks and travelled on old steam trains before returning to Glasgow and then going west through Wales.

Onto the Ferry for our trip across the Irish Sea to Dublin where we had two days enjoying Irish hospitality and funny tales. We visited a 7th Century Monastery at Glendalough which was very interesting. Heading North West to Sligo we got to see how very green and picturesque Ireland really is – definitely 40 shades of green!!

It was there in the NW where we hired a car for a day, so that we could take ourselves to the tiny village of Pettigo to see where my grandfather came from back in the 1880s. Such a tiny little town on the border with Northern Ireland, but very colourful just the same. We enjoyed a bowl of home-made country vegetable soup before exploring – looking for anyone with the name of Johnston (my maiden name). Didn't take long when we found a motor workshop with the name Mervyn Johnston on the wall, so we marched in and made ourselves known. Mervyn probably wasn't a cousin but it didn't matter – he had a BMC workshop and was working on racing Minis!! He also had a Mini Ute (he called it a pickup) which he uses for delivering oil to his customers.

The rest of the trip around the coast of Ireland from NW in Donegal, south through Galway, Cliffs of Moher, Limerick, Tralee, Dingle and Waterford was some of the most beautiful countryside we've ever seen. The people were all so happy and very welcoming. Our ferry trip back across to Wales brought us to the port of Fishguard and this was one of the few days where we experienced rain – the weather had been mainly beautiful with clear skies. The last night of our Trafalgar Tour was in Cardiff where we were joined by friends and P76 Car Club Members, Jane and Alan Firth, who drove from their home in SW England to the Welsh Capital to be with us for dinner and overnight. We enjoyed a wonderful dinner at the Milennium Centre in Cardiff and we were entertained by Welsh singers and musicians.

It was great to catch up with the Firths we hadn't seen them since the 2015 P76 Nationals in South Australia!!
