Paul's Targa — Back from the Brink!

There is probably little need to write something about the more common areas of a 'P' prone to rusting because anyone that has been involved with this marque for a while would be more than familiar with them.

Given that I had a couple of photos of my recent rust excavations though, and also that we needed something to fill some space in this issue, I thought it might be interesting, if not useful to show what I have been up to so far.






The guys that do my pink slips have a reputation of being tough. So when I took the Targa to them in 2017, prior to attacking any of the rust bits, they suggested it was touch and go so I had to promise them that I was in the process of tackling the rusty bit and it was not likely to be used much until I had.

Rust in the bottom corners of the doors is not common but relatively easy to detect, with the tell tale bubbles in the paint evident at an early stage.

If you hide the car under a tarp for a few years as this one had been, these areas can become quite extensive and effect both



sides of the door skin. There are no repair panels for these sections so they have to be cut out, treated and replacement sections fashioned and welded in place - tedious but satisfying.

I'm not a welder or a fabricator so don't judge me too harshly but if you know what you're looking to achieve it's amazing what you can do in the garage after a bit of research.

I started the task of repairing and rebuilding the Targa with the passenger side door, because it looked to be one of the worst pieces on the car.



But lurking under those lovely stainless stone guards at the rear of the sill panel was more of the dreaded cancer. The car came with repair panels to cover these more complex curves, although they still needed a bit of persuasion to take on exactly the right shape.





The front of the sill, behind the front wheel looked OK. In fact, I didn't bother to take many photos of this area because I thought it would clean up reasonably quickly.

To my dismay, after a bit of gentle prodding and rubbing I revealed something which

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could feature in a book of "How not to do panel repairs"

Below is what the front of the sill looked like before my investigations began, it just didn't look as though it was going to be a big job.

After a bit of gentle prodding however it became obvious that this area was going to be a challenge.



The removal of nearly1/2kg of foreign material, was a clear sign that this been repaired previously. I removed an assortment of materials from this area including flyscreen,



chicken wire, bog, as well as the normal accumulation of sand and dirt from the road. It really is worth removing the cover strip and ensuring this area is kept clean from debris.

One of the problems of filling a void like this is that it puts the inner sill panel in touch with the guard panel and as this wad of material gathered moisture, the moisture was transferred to the inner sill.


At this stage of the process



the rego on the Targa had expired which left me with 3 months to do the drivers side of the car before I had to either get it finished or hand the plates in and start the process over with a Blue slip, not a desirable position.

Moving to the drivers side, I





started at the front of the sill, however any hope that the drivers side was going to take less work were soon dashed.

The work on the drivers side was obviously done by the same person using the same techniques and materials. I

just hoped no foxes were able to get into the chicken pen with so much of it missing!

The inner sill was affected



again and had to be removed and replaced.

From here I moved onto the drivers door which was in better shape than its passenger side counterpart.

From here onto the rear sill panel and again, under that shiny stone guard was more



rust to be attended to.


The drivers side was similar to the passenger side although there were bigger problems with the rear guard on this side.

The fuel filler panel had

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some of those tell tale bubbles under the paint.

My investigations revealed that this panel had also been the subject of repair. On this occasion a metal piece had been spot welded over the damage which didn't seem to have been removed properly, leading to the re-emergence of rust.





Below is the area after removal of rusted material and treatment with the POR 15 system.



And in the following after the replacement panel had been welded


into place.

Of course the rear guard turned into a nightmare with the LPG filler hole having to be welded shut and some more rust work to the rear of the wheel arch.



I can happily report however that all the work required to go back for a pink slip was all done with 2 days to spare before the expiry of the 3 months grace period on the rego expiry.

Rego done, it was back to the garage and onto the turret which had suffered



badly under that tarp.

There is a long way to go with this 'Work in Progress' but I hope it may have been interesting and possibly useful to others contemplating some of this work or just wondering where to look and what you might find. *Paul*

DR PHILTHY'S TECH TIPS

EXHAUST PIPE "COLLARS"

Recently HOS, my mongrelised Super/Deluxe firewood-hauling 4-speed P76 suffered three massive 'roo hits which basically destroyed the front exhaust pipes, near to the 90° bend where they go from horizontal to vertical, to be bolted against the exhaust manifolds.

Normally if the front "engine pipes" cop a big hit, the only damage will be a cracked exhaust "O" ring, but in HOS's case, both of the engine pipes suffered circumferential splitting of the top end of each engine pipe, just where the "collars" would normally press up against the flared ends of the pipes to hold them securely in place against the outlets of the exhaust manifolds.

HOS had been fitted with a sporty-sounding twin-system which had a nice note to it and that system had previously done a few years' service on a certain famous green Targa without giving any trouble, but obviously the Targa had not been driven over any large, lumpy, stupid wildlife.

When the damaged pipes were removed from HOS, the reason for the pipes splitting around the base circumference of the flared section became obvious – the "collars" which hold the engine pipes against the exhaust manifolds had both been fitted to the engine pipes upside down!!

If you take a close look at an exhaust pipe "collar", you will notice that one side is basically flat, while there is a taper on the other side. There are two reasons for having this 'taper'.

Firstly, when the "collar" is fitted to the engine pipe the right way up, the matching taper in the exhaust manifold outlet helps to seat or centre the exhaust "O" ring as the two bolts (or nuts if you're still original) that hold the "collar" and the engine pipe are tightened.

Secondly, by having a greater area of contact between the tapered side of the "collar" and the flared top end of each engine pipe, the stresses of road-use are spread over a larger area, promoting a longer service life of the "O" ring and the flared end of the exhaust pipe.

In HOS's case, because the "collars" were both fitted upside down, the effective area of clamping pressure was concentrated on a relatively small section of each engine pipe, leading to premature failure (splitting) of the bottom of the flared ends after repeated 'roo strikes!! Thanks Skippy!
