

Ford or Holden for Ford vs Holden Day on August 29


Hot Rod Day is September 26


A great day out is **28 November for Vintage Car Day** I hope to have the P76 there for that day as well.







Life circle of Leyland P76 Chassis 076B4S 3A4 2363

1973 October: Sydney Launch of the Leyland P76. The launch was visited by a couple of Kiwi's on holiday in Sydney, after seeing the Launch advertised in the local newspaper. Dennis and Margaret Porter from Hamilton visited the display. Dennis was taken by the P76's on display, but he couldn't purchase one as NZ had not yet been established as a market, so he ordered a Nutmeg Super to be delivered to Hamilton NZ as soon as possible

1974 March: The Nutmeg V8 Super was delivered to Hamilton, and registered as HA3956, the local NZMC agent (Ex Dominion Motors) begged Dennis to leave the car in the showroom for a week as this was the First P76 in captivity at the time. I remember traveling into the city with Mum on a Hamilton Blue Bus SB3 Bedford to collect the car. Dad loved his P76, washing it every weekend.

1976: At the age of 15 I got my Driver's License in this car. I remember that the Traffic Cop could only talk about the P76 and had no interest in my driving ability.

1979: Dennis Porter passed away

1981: Margret used her artistic talent and had the Leyland resprayed in Champagne Pink Metallic.

<u>1987:</u> Leyland for reluctant sale, 160,000km, Super Auto, One Owner, fully rebuilt Motor and Box, 60lit CNG tank, New Paint Price \$6,000. Sold to a Bob Barris, who repainted the car the Light Blue.

<u>1994:</u> The car was sold to Warren Clayton Green a Farmer in the Te Kuiti area. The registration was changed to a personalized plate <u>WCG</u>, and changed again to <u>SR3873</u> in June <u>1994</u>

1998: I tracked the ownership of the car to Te Kuiti and offered to purchase the car for personal reasons. The Green's said I could have the car for \$ 9,000, well over its value then. I kept that phone number for 23 years. The car has sat in a barn, virtually unused for the last 15 years.

2021: I knew the car was still in the system and on a whim I contacted the Green's again, must have got them on right day as I got it for \$ 7,500, the engine and transmission had been overhauled and the car ran sweetly on the way home, apart from some minor Brake issues.

<u>Future:</u> I will drive the car over the Winter, finding and fixing things as I go, a new Carb is on order, the Original Air cleaner and filter are back in place, the Original Fuel pump needs to go, an Original Grill has gone back on with my father's old AA badge to be fitted, a new speedo cable and other bits are being sourced and fitted. The paint will be Media Blasted and Stripped to allow a repaint in Nutmeg, the car had been Gold Sealed back in the day, so rust is minimal,

An original purchase from 1986 was found in the boot, a Front Headlight Unit, still in its box with Margaret's Handwriting.

On the wish list is a Rear Window Louvre, Boot Mat, Modified Door sill plates, Good Heater.

It is Awesome to have her back and I won't let her slip away again, the memories it has brought back to myself, and Margaret is great.



army truck!



Club Registration Records, held, compiled, sorted, and sometimes chucked up in the air by Allan Caple.

You may recall hearing talk of this man in Waverley that is fascinated by registration numbers, particularly those pertaining to Leyland P76's. Quite a few of us have met him and his family, Leah, Justin and Kimberley over the years and I know that the work he does is terribly important in our bid to build a history of P76 in New Zealand and it also provides us with information enabling us, or Allan, to answer the many enquiries we get about Grandads P76 and the like. Yes, we do get them. Our wedding cars, my uncles Leyland etc.

Recently Allan published/posted the following piece on Facebook and was overjoyed (it was joy wasn't it Allan) at the response the post generated. Read on:

Apart from being a P-nut (P76 enthusiast), one of my interests/hobbies is trying to compile a complete record of all the Leyland P76 vehicles that have been registered in New Zealand, along with as complete a history of ownership as possible. For the last few years, I have gathered information from a number of sources but primarily the NZ Leyland P76 Owners Club of which I am a member. I acknowledge that information comes from other sources and I'm very grateful to those who contribute.

At this time, I maintain a register that contains 1731 cars. Due to the lack of some vehicle identifying details (registration plate, chassis numbers, etc), it is possible that the number of cars is inflated by some double ups. I have 345 cars with no rego plate numbers and 227 cars with no chassis number: some of these missing both. 714 have no colour and about the same number have no engine number. All these details help to identify and eliminate duplicate records.

The register contains the name of 1849 owners. All these names are associated with at least one car with a few having had several vehicles over the years. I only record names and locations in the register, not specific addresses, or other contact details, and I don't share any detail when asked not to. It is a matter of privacy and respect. Generally, I make a note of owners who I know have had a car, but I can't link to a specific vehicle. Sometimes the name will provide a link at a later time and complete a sequence of ownership.

Leyland Queries from By-gone Years.

So why am I sharing all of this?

I am looking for people who have owned or do own a P76. Any information is potentially useful but rego numbers and chassis numbers are gold. Names and approximate dates of ownership, especially in conjunction with regos, are good too. Histories of ownership, such as ownership papers, provide details that are often lost to memory.

It is 55 years since the last Leyland P76 rolled off the assembly line (in New Zealand). By the time I took over this project in about 2006, a lot of these vehicles had already disappeared from our roads. Some information has already been lost and will never be found. But there are those who can contribute to help keep history alive regarding these particular cars and those who have owned them.

Please contact me through Messenger on Facebook initially and provide contact details so we can chat.

As a final point, there are a lot of vehicles out there that could be remembered in a similar way. The classic car community are guardians of this type of information, and they do a very good job. If this isn't being done already, maybe there are those who might like to do something similar to what I'm doing for another make/model. Just a thought!

Many of the questions that I have previously presented for Penzed have dated back many years. Realistically, the chances of getting answers are quite slim, given the years that have passed and the memories that have faded. Having said that, some answers have been forthcoming that surprised me and perhaps even those who supplied them. Thank you to those people.

Recently, I asked on a couple of Facebook pages for information and the response was amazing. Usually, registration numbers are the starting point for tracking a P76, but names and places were offered and as a result I was able to complete a couple of vehicle ownership histories. In addition, I have received various names and contact details that will further my ability to trace cars and their history. I even have 2 people who have asked about joining our Club.

The following queries are a little more recent but nonetheless important to the completion of the Club's register.

HG9062, PMAG Super, ex Taxi. This car was up for sale along with HG3834. David Timms bought HG3834 but not HG9062. The car's registration was cancelled but we'd like to know where it ended up?

<u>Tony Collins, Taihape.</u> Apparently, Tony was the local Leyland dealer in Taihape for many years. He would have had a lot of local knowledge about who bought what in the area. I suspect, if he is still alive, he will be getting advanced in years by now and, if he is around, he may still have knowledge that may help us. Does anyone know if he is still around?

<u>HC6702</u>, <u>Orange Super.</u> This car was owned by Matthew Coffin, Petone, but that was a few years ago. The car is still on registration exemption, due to expire 3 May 2022 so may be still around somewhere. Does anyone know Matthew or his whereabouts, and what happened to the car?

GT3818, White Deluxe. Last owner was T J Thompson, Invercargill. The car's last WoF expired 23 March 2021 and it is on exemption to 23 September, 2021. We have no contact details for Mr Thompson. Can anyone help?

<u>HJ6990, AEB Deluxe.</u> Sold by Martin Perry (Hinds Bus and Truck Ltd) but we don't know who to. Car is on exemption to 3 September 2021. Can anyone help?

Any information on these cars, or any other cars, is gratefully received. The task is still huge and I rely on others to provide details of vehicles purchased and sold to keep everything up to date. I am also open to questions about specific cars from club members and I will provide what information I can. Please note; I do not record specific contact details for owner names and therefore I can't supply that information. The register only shows locations.
