## Leyland P76 National Rally & AGM

## New Plymouth Friday 11 - Monday 14 March 2022

Due to the traffic light system and government requirements only those who are fully vaccinated (two injections) will be able to attend. The motel and anywhere we are eating will require everyone to produce their vaccination passes.

Proposed program

Arrive Friday 11 at Motel in New Plymouth

On Saturday 12 we start with a car display next to the Windwand on New Plymouth foreshore. Time for a bit of retail therapy and checking out local attractions. Puke Ariki Museum and the Len-Lye Centre (with its amazing mirrored exterior) are no more than a 5 minute walk away.

A 20-minute drive for lunch to the Holden Museum with opportunities to try the luge and the mini putt, along with looking at over 40 Holden cars, a Peter Brock tribute and a few motorbikes. On the way back to the motel a visit to one man's railway layouts will leave everyone amazed.

In the evening we have the AGM and dinner, with a possible guest speaker.

Sunday13 starts with the time-honoured car boot sale followed by a drive down south to Hawera, where we can have a look at the Cardonal Classic car collection, with lunch at Tawhiti museum and time to look at the displays.

After lunch we visit a Studebaker collection and have afternoon tea at the Cape Egmont lighthouse, with our own private air display by Brett Emeny and some of his friends in Yak 52s.

Dinner back in New Plymouth

Monday 14 is Taranaki Anniversary Day so time for a relaxing ride on the train at Waitara followed by a chance to have a sightseeing flight on the only World War 2 Catalina in New Zealand. Lunch will be at the airport – best to go on the flight then have lunch.

Note that the plane seats 16 (3 already booked) and the flight is over New Plymouth and down to Oakura and back – about 25 minutes. Cost will be \$250 per person, you will fly at 1000 to 1200 feet at a speed of around 120 knots. There are fantastic views, and you can move around within the plane to take advantage of the blister canopies. The air display and the Cataline flights are subject to the weather.

Over the last three or four years I have had the opportunity to further enhance what was once a New Zealand assembled Deluxe model. Enhancements started as soon as I purchased the car in 1989 but mechanically apart from a 4-speed gearbox, power steering and 200mm Targa wheels nothing changed.

Before the Cromwell AGM I had fitted extractors and a twin 50mm exhaust system. It didn't help much as the engine was getting tired and had developed a tapping noise, a suspected cracked piston skirt which proved to be the problem.

The engine was sent off to be fully reconditioned by Steve Hunwick. It was bored 10 thou oversize, Rover pistons fitted, crankshaft was so good that it only had to be linished. I sent the front cover down to John Harcourt to do mods to the oil pump, a stage 2 camshaft, Edelbrock 500 electric choke carb and I bought a Willpower inlet manifold from Sydney and found some second hand Edelbrock chrome rocker covers on the internet, engine sorted.

Noel Delforce supplied new Holden front strut inserts with Toyota tops. That was an expensive exercise as it was too harsh "Now for sale". I went back to the P76 struts "much better" but the one thing that made a huge difference to the whole car was the rear shocks. Hal Moloney had recommended them to me as I had never been satisfied with the road holding of the car compared to my old P76 Super, they are Rancho part # 99136 adjustable shocks at around \$400 retail per pair, but you won't buy better off the shelf, they transformed the whole car.

I had the single rail close ratio gearbox reconditioned and fitted a Quick-Change gear lever mod made by Dale Gollen in Australia, also had new bearings in the diff so now I'm happy with the mechanicals. I looked at the body and that too was looking a bit tired, so I set about stripping the car body - doors - windows everything had to come out before we took it up to Kevin Barkler in Hawera to work his magic on it. He does a brilliant job of painting. All I had to do was put it back together. That was the hard part. Now at last I am very happy with the car. Ron's car is painted in its original New Zealand only colour, French Blue.

Now I can get back to the house maintenance. Ron's car in July 1989, the beginning!





I shouted a Christmas cake for those attending, as promised and this was shared with the P People, a Sunbeamer Brian, Joe and his partner, Selwyn with an MX5 from the VCC, a previous P76 owner and Bernie from the Vauxhall Club in his Rover. Turns out Lance and Brian are long time old mates and none of us knew we each had known each other for years! Small world - Mr Longstaff, the son/grandson of an old P76 member was also there in his Plymouth Cranbrook seen in last year's Penzed. On the following photo page we see a random selection of really nice cars, the Mk 4 Jaguar was exquisite and may have been in Penzed before (don't care) The Bentley hasn't appeared before and it may be that the Rover SD1 van den Plas has too some years back, but again, these are scarcely seen these days so.... The little car next to it is an Almac, not an MG, the next one is an MG. And lastly, we have an Alfa Romeo because of my obsession! Next year I must get a Sunbeam and some Americana, also well represented by Chevrolet in particular. Lance's Austin 3 litre attracted a huge amount of attention., see it below.











## Where have we been all these years?

This question arose at the Gisborne AGM, asked by Lyn Morris. An interesting question I thought, one that I should be able to answer with more than just a list of locations. I suggested I would take care of it using my AGM Booklet file. Well guess what, here it is a wet day after Christmas and I found the email following on from the AGM, so I grab out my file to find two surprising things! It starts at the 7th AGM and records my appointment to Natcom as early as March 1991! And here I still am. So now the search of the shed for earlier records begins. I wonder if my appointment goes any earlier.

I now think it appropriate to fill in the earlier blanks as well for the many members who won't know of our formation. To this end I sought the first "Blue Penzed' and for some years Penzed's will be my record up to the 1991 AGM Booklet. The first and only issue of Penzed to have an A4 format with a cover printed on dark blue paper. And my how the print quality has improved over the last 30 odd years! Edward Tubman and the late Dale Rawlings were the men behind the formation of our club. Thanks guys.

So, in late 1983 a test meeting to gauge public response was held. This proved quite promising. Sadly, I couldn't be there, plans changed when my girlfriend got sick, so I stayed with her having phoned Edward or Dale to lodge my apologies. Hindsight and all that. Apparently, Ed's 4 a.m. finish the morning of the meeting meant he wasn't there either!

Effectively the foundation meeting was held at **Queen Elizabeth Hospital in Hamilton** in later in November 1983. This was a big meeting and as I recall I was the first to arrive, after Dale and Ed of course. I had a spectacular trip from Taupo to Hamilton- took 90 minutes, I seem to remember meeting Alec and Joan Reid there and winning a small prize for the whitest exhaust pipes. Those were the days of leaded petrol and one pretty sweet Country Cream Super V8. There were a lot of P76's, more than I had ever seen together before.

A Special General meeting was held in Taupo in July 1984 to determine club incorporation, formation of National Body and a range of other administrative necessities including the location of the next full and proper AGM.

The first AGM was at The Voyager Motel 107 Ranolf Street Rotorua on Saturday 29 June 1985. I was there but have no strong recollections of the event.

Southwards Car Museum Otaihanga Saturday 28 June 1986 saw the next AGM, again not too many recollections but the move to a March AGM was mooted and passed. Photos would indicate my CC S V8 was sporting the number plate LP76 by then. Yes, I still have it, it is silver on black and live and not for sale. I did discover another poem to reissue to you all and put on the web site, written by the late Bill Bolt, the then Treasurer.

March 28th, 1987, saw the big move to Auckland at the Officers Club 14 Edgerley Ave Newmarket. Now this AGM I remember without reading the reports in Penzed. David Brown and I took the overnight train to Auckland from Wellington, arriving in time to get changed at the lovely Waipuna Lodge then go with Bill Bolt to run in the Round the Bays Run. Rob 52min, Bill 55 mins and David 57 mins. This caused me to miss my 10th Acacia Bay Run in Taupo which I had every intention of returning to compete in, but the Club called. We ran in our new Leyland P76 Club shirts of course. The venue was superb, the Reid's hospitality at the end of the weekend equally so and the train ride home as interesting as the journey up. And so much more! Met many new faces, cemented friendships, and had a ball.

Palmerston North March 26th, 1988, saw the next and biggest gathering of P76's to have occurred in New Zealand to date. Assembled at the Albert Motor Lodge 300 Main Street, we were overwhelmed at the appearance of P76's just rolling in the drive. Many non-members, several joined, so many colours. This is when I met Trevor Day and his gorgeous HOTO S. Trevor just threw me the keys and said go for it! Thanks Mate, I did, and it was fun. Possibly one of our earliest Aussie visitors too. John Lobban, a real "character" he showed all who were interested how to remove a P76 windscreen quickly at about 4.40 p.m. on Saturday. Poor Bill Bolt! Such a great weekend. Just P76's everywhere. A glance at the May 88 Penzed shows Jan Wilkinson wrote the main report, partner Terry Offord wrote a report for the Evening Standard, the local paper, and Geoff Ogilvie's P76 was sporting the personalised plate P76 along with my LP76 plate, and Ian and Terri Turner resigned by way of a short poem rather than a letter. It too will be added to the web site and included in Penzed at some point.


This issue also tells of the first deep south member joining. In the Troop Movements we have N S Benfell of Balclutha listed. I wonder if this does indicate the first southerner.


Hamilton March 18th 1989 Hillcrest Lodge 334 Cobham Drive. While the March Penzed doesn't have any event details of the AGM weekend it amazingly list 38 new members! some of whom are still with us like Graeme Storer, Rick Cooper and Barry Brown. And several who have passed away Like Messer's Bossward, Dodgshun and Hirst. Some of the cars are still in the club, the Martin car with the 3rd generation of family, the Wright car having had a few new owners, the owner of the CW D we saw in Nelson with the UK plate, Clyde, your BA car now moved on. So many names I recognise and knew personally, F Elias, J Ward, MJ Craw etc.

And the report includes many memories like the Fletcher car from Gisborne with the Perspex bonnet and a myriad of additional features. A telephone dial (remember now) set into the rear guard with his business phone number written onto musical score lines. Part of his many facetted businesses. A member arrived on a BSA Goldstar, it's in a photo, Ed's car sporting "MY P76" plates. Philip Vallance came up from Masterton. I recall we parked up somewhere and as usual someone (Alec I'm sure) had to go down the road for something leaving a gap in a large line of Leyland's. What should pop into that gap but a Skoda 110. It took but a moment of stern looks form the guys about to persuade the lady driver to move off and allow the big B as B P76 back into its rightful place. And it was here that rear window louvre orders were taken. And we took a jaunt along the river in a paddle steamer and ate raspberry scones.

Looking ahead to find the 1990 venue I noticed that I became a member of Natcom as notified in July 1989 as Publicity Officer. By this time, I had moved to Wellington and was living in Dee St in Island Bay. Not a place to house a car on the street as anyone who saw my poor CC S in its later years will understand. I recall this position may have come about by my winning the number plate spotting competition (or not) but it did involve publicity. Getting us out in the public eye, notifying anyone who'd listen about our events, chasing more new members, ensuring local newspapers had stories to publish prior to our AGM's. At this early stage the term National Rally had not been coined for us. This has really been a light-hearted but truly fun and enlightening voyage for me so far and will obviously become an ongoing series. I hope it's not too tedious for you the reader, hence the limit to two pages. Never intended to be in depth either we will have to await the arrival of some stories from **Kennedy Park in Napier March 10th 1990**. And boy are there a few from 1990, Ron B and David B feature.
