


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P76, anything but average

Penzed for July 2022



In part due to not much happening, little has been reported yet. I know Reefton has a big car show in about 50 odd hours from now, but I don't have the report yet. Bruce Cooper and I were waving the P76 flag on a VCC Rally last weekend and may do so again in a fortnight. The second rally will generate photos for sure as it's a gravel event possibly to an outback collection, this has yet to be decided. We participated hard but I don't think we were very competitive but then we only used our local knowledge and hope whereas we are sure Google Maps helped many a participant. We covered 200 miles, had a ball, put faces to names and saw some lovely cars.

Amongst those competing was a HA SL90 Viva, 47 Talbot, Rolls Royce 20/50, VC Valiant, 45 Ford truck and similar Chev model, Austin 7 or 10 tourer, 35 Ford, Saab 96, 37 Plymouth, Morris Minor low light convertible, S2 Morris Minor, 60 Mk 2 Jaguar, MGB Roadster and a few others I don't recall.

The P76 was well admired by many of the crews, some never having seen a 6 cyl one before and many asked about the 44-gallon drum – no it wasn't in the boot. The Rolls owner showed us how well engineered his car was by operating all the various controls for fuel mixture throttle and something else from the steering wheel while we watched astonished as many levers, rods and springs did their thing along side the huge engine block. Parts Parts Parts Parts Parts PARTS and Bits and PIECES

Thanks to Ron Butler for the following information. Ron advised that his new engine was using a bit of oil, so he invested in some valve stem seals from BNT and these fixed the issue.

Permaseal brand Valve Stem Seal set VSS0118-04, come in a set of 4 so you will need 4 sets.

And in his own words. I decided to give my clutch linkages a spruce up that involved removing the clutch cable and cross shaft. That's everything from the pedal to the clutch fork. The cross shaft is hollow on the chassis side to take a nylon sleeve mounted on a ball-ended solid shaft which bolts onto the chassis. To keep grease in and dirt out. There is a rubber boot fixed on the hollow shaft but sliding on the solid shaft. Now unobtainable.

I went online to Basis LTD in Renwick just outside Blenheim email sales@basisnz.co.nz Website www.basisnz.co.nz all their products are shown with measurements. I selected a Boot Tie Rod end pair, 17H3501 their part # 285.005 \$ 7.60 freight \$5.60 gst \$1.72 total \$13.20 delivery 2 days. This Boot is a perfect fit and with new clevis pins and R clips it's just the cat's whiskers.

On a Facebook page for P76's Nick K and Stuart B were discussing V8 air filters and how to set up an alternative. First buy a Ryco A142 filter, I checked and these are still available, and then use it as a pattern to cut the flange/skirt off the P76 filter which you glue into the top of the filter housing. Done correctly the A142 will slot into the skirt providing a good seal and away you go. I believe the P76 correct filter is now quite hard to come buy and these two gentlemen discussing this option are quite well-respected Leyland Owners in Australia.

Where have we been all these years?

March 23, 1991, Southwards Car Museum, Otaihanga Road, Paraparaumu was the venue for the 1991 AGM, and I was there, it's recorded in the Minutes. What happened at this event with 26 members and partners present? Nothing is jumping into my brain!

Subs remained unchanged, wonder of wonders, the committee was re-elected unopposed, and the P76 Spotter Competition was still the most productive recruitment method. The meeting opened at 2.07 and closed at 2.46. Incredible! I shall now see if my photo albums jog a memory of what we did as still nothing has popped into my head yet!

I did find some average photos of 17 P76's lined up in the car park. These appear on the cover and below I will try to determine the fate of each car going L to R top to bottom. It won't be terribly happy reading! Remember, comments refer to the car, not the 1991 owner.

Jones - gone, Tubman – still but ON now, Knight – gone, Hooper – still around chasing owner, J/B/B – Jones Butler and Bolt owned, sold within club and since disappeared, Tapp -in private collection not in club, Paton – gone NB this car carried the only Hairy Lime panel I have ever seen in New Zealand, Butler – still, Butler – shed stored in oblivion by ex-member, Bolt – HOTO 6D gone, van Kampen – still, Lewis – I'm unsure, Lyons – it remains unclear but this car appears to have gone to Merv Cox and may be the one written off outside Woodville, Crafts – gone, Brown – gone, Reid – still, Fong – gone.

I'm sorry but other than visiting the museum I recall little, but I think it was this year a bus load of Japanese tourists arrived and spent ages looking over these unknown cars before entering the museum and I'm sure Len Southward came out for a look at them as well. I recall staying outside to keep an eye on the display and Len appeared for a brief chat about the P76's.

March 14, 1992, Hobson Motor Inn Hobsonville Auckland. I have much greater recollection of this event, the cars, the people, my Sonya being with me. Special cars like Ian Ballantine's Datsun 260C P76 V8, a beautiful conversion with a 5spd box, headers fed through the inner guards and other go-fast bits attached. Resplendent in metallic blue with a white roof, Wayne Fletchers custom P76 with the see-through bonnet and so many other extras. A very trim Gordon Gruebner graced the cover of Penzed with his now long gone Nutmeg V8 PU647. The Monterey Park Vintage and Classic Car Museum, full of beautiful Packard's and which I now believe has a B as B V8 stored in it too.

We were still chasing the elusive louvre order then and looking at front indicator remanufacture. These still occasionally find their way back to us but the louvres not so much! Gordon Gruebner became our new Vice President; Constitutional amendments were approved as was the idea of granting temporary membership to visiting Aussie Club members and our fees remained the same. Visiting either Aussie or New Zealand now, members are just made welcome wherever you go as many of us can confirm. I will raid the old albums and see what I can find for you. Bear in mind it was 1992 and print technology has improved 100-fold since so reproduction of any of the grainy black and white photos appearing in the Penzed's is not going to happen and they can't all be mine or in my albums but I know there are some. Bill Bolt arrived in his newly panel and painted car, the one that appears on our old past it's use by date membership application. Yes, we are working on it.

Car For Sale

And again, Allan Caple was discussing a P76 with an ex-owner who in fact had been looking at another car that was for sale. He had decided against it but offered Allan the contact details for him to pursue. This he did and it is for sale and turns out that the car was in the club from 1988 until 1996 with Mr Russell Askew, listed in the Pukekohe area on our very old address lists. His son Scott has the car in storage and the time has come for it to find a new home.

Details as we know it, a Nutmeg Executive V8 on LPG, the car was GZ9164 then UD6427 being deregistered in May 1998. Below, Scott describes the car as it is now.

LPG and petrol changeover valve, I think the fuel lines to the petrol tank perished so I have only had it running on LPG.

Upholstery is very worn out would need full replacement.

Been in covered storage since last rego in 1997. Does have bits of rust but nothing terminal.

Body is in pretty good condition.

Did have it running and moving under its own power in February, but I think it might have finally ran out of LPG and tank is way out of reg.
