Penzed for September 2022

This issue is one of celebration in several ways. Contained within is the Eulogy from George Weigel's memorial service as given by Don Alexander, there is acknowledgement of the more recent loss of one of the big men of the Central Group and as you might have guessed from the cover photos, if you have been around long enough, I am celebrating my thirtieth anniversary as Editor of Penzed. Those are the P76's that have brought me and us, Sonya, Megan, Abby, and I and often nephew Jared along for the ride to so many places around New Zealand and indeed Australia. I shall list their specifications below:

1973 Super HN4750/LP76 Country Cream/Imperial Leather 3 speed col auto V8, bought into New Zealand in 1977. I was the second owner and did over 100,000 miles in this lovely car before the build quality succumbed to life in southern Wellington! Photo at Lyell Bay.

1974 Deluxe HD4302 Home on the O'range/Imperial Leather 5 speed manual V8, second owners after we bought it off a member in Gisborne. Set up for towing, not performance it was gradually repurposed and became an immensely fun car to drive, except around Wellington and similar places. Dismantled it now assists many other cars to stay on the road. I was just looking at our Pukekohe lap times certificates from 2000, set in HOTO, whilst looking for something else. Great times. Photo on maiden voyage home from Gisborne.

1974 Deluxe HA4915 Bold as Brass/Parchment 3 speed column auto 6. We bought this car off my parents, some of a long list of previous owners. Now owned by the Club President she still sports her bench front seat, a real rarity these days. Photo BCD 1996 McKay's crossing.

1974 Deluxe HE3969 Am Eye Blue/ Casino Blue 3 speed manual column change. "George" as the car is known came with the basic's, rubber floor mat, bench seat, real skinny wheels, and tyres. Bought off a local member in 2001 and subsequently improved in so many ways, George serves us very well and may become infamous (hopefully famous) next year when the movie he has been starring in is released. Denniston 2017, after the Cromwell NR&AGM.

CC and HOTO are gone, serving many other P76 owners as parts but LP76 is still a live plate set. A lemon-coloured wreck I could never identify graced our yard for a while. It belonged to a bloke I went to school with, Alan the builder. When I finally took possession of the car I paid Helen, who used to be Alan. That came as a bit of a surprise to me! Ron and Bill and I bought a CB Super from Stokes Valley that ultimately came back into being with a member and subsequently disappeared again. Where has it gone? So, there is your cover story in part.

In late July 1992 Editor/Treasurer Bill Bolt passed away unexpectedly and I took up the reins to get the September Penzed 1992 out to members and lo and behold here I am thirty years later typing it up myself. Believe me there are many a fine typist who helped me with this over the early years, some to great levels. Nadine was one who did an awful lot but probably the most input came from Linda Graham, who many of you now know as Paul Heath's partner. I would draft it and Linda would produce it in hard copy and I suppose ultimately electronically whereupon I would assemble a magazine from many sources and get it copied/printed and out to you, the reader. I cannot thank people like Nadine and Linda enough for the help thy gave me and all of us in those earlier years. I guess as technology changed so did my need to learn how to do such things myself! I must also again thank the many and sometimes regular contributors to Penzed that allow you to read something other than that written by me and to see photos of places where I just couldn't be. I have enjoyed this job immensely over the years and hope my haphazard time keeping, this month is an example, hasn't been too much for your bear. As far as I can recall I have missed only one issue (Sept 2015?) and we have had a combined one in more recent times due to my being overseas in a given January. So please enjoy what follows.

And as happens so often, the order/format changes so for now we are going into a little chapter to be called **Miscellaneous Leyland Bits**

I think the Stag only made it to a Christmas party and I cannot locate the myriad of photos I took on the day! They also had a David Brown 990 tractor which only a few months earlier Bruce Cooper bought off them. The day of Clive's funeral was wet and miserable to say the least but inside the celebration of a great man, great husband, father and car enthusiast was to produce, dare I say it, one of the most joyous and jovial funerals one could ever attend.

Loved by so many people, the gentle giant was farewelled by at least eight P76 Club members, maybe as many Daimler Club members, the local VFB which we learnt was started by his dad, the Manawatu Car Club, and so many other people. There was obviously more to this bloke than we ever knew. The anecdotes had the assemblage laughing through the tears. We will continue to support Carol as she moves into her new life. As presented by Don Alexander. Before I start, I would like to express an apology from my wife Jenifer who is recovering from a stroke and cannot be with us today. George was born 1927, an only child to a privileged family, educated at St Andrews College, Papanui, George was always the gentleman, well dressed and well mannered. He grew up surrounded by fast cars and aeroplanes. He was an accomplished pilot. He joined his father's photography business, and many Christchurch families have an old photograph taken of them in the square and Weigel stamped on the bottom. There he met the lovely Noeline who became his wife and the love of his life, his other love being his Leyland P76.

George was one of the early members of the Canterbury branch (*appears on the Maps in 1992*) and attended the meetings regularly. Noeline accompanied him to each meet but was too shy to join us and always waited outside in the car for George. They ran Newbury Lodge, a beautiful wedding and function centre in Opawa that had originally been the Weigel family home. One of our daughters was lucky enough to have her wedding there.

I remember an AGM gathering held at our home on Mt Pleasant in 1999 and Noeline and George were present. Imagine our shock and sorrow only a few days later to learn that Noeline had suddenly passed away. The light disappeared from George's eyes from then on, and it wasn't until sometime later when Sandy appeared that George smiled again. Sandy joined the Club and rose to become President for several years. These were happy years for George, as Sandy drove the P76 to all the events. However old age and ill health started to take its toll and outings became fewer.

From their home on Huntsbury Hill, George and Sandy welcomed visitors who popped in for a chat with George and to reminisce about the good old days.

George loved his car until the end, and it was hard for him to re-home it with Paul and Dawn Jones when the time came.

Sonya and I well recall meeting George and Noeline at Don and Jenifer's' in 1999. We had the most interesting conversation with them, especially Noeline relating their travel experiences on their honeymoon! Before Covid at our local fish and chip shop you could browse a couple of very old Beaded Wheels magazines amongst the others stacked in a corner. Imagine my surprise to find a photo of Don and Jenifer dining at some function and reading of how some chap had bought the 4.5L Bentley off Weigel the photographer and proceeded to race it and take it back to Blighty! George, Noeline and then Sandy I feel are all from the same pod, people of great humility, friendship, and care.

George was obviously held in much affection by the Southern Group and others who had met him be it with Noeline or Sandy. He was as I've said before one of the Club's elder statesmen in the good company of the late Fleming Biddick, also from Southern Group and Alex Reid, our Northern Group contender and late of the Central Group, Merv Cox. Good keen men who love/d life and their P76's.

Let us hope some of us ascend to such a plane in the coming years.

Trust you are all well and enjoying your P76's. Speaking of which I have decided to sell my Bold as Brass 6-cylinder P76.

There are various reasons for this. The main ones are that it tends to sit in the shed and is not getting used as it should, and I need to spend some time and money on getting the V8 back on the road and competing in events.

The car is a **Bold as Brass 6 cylinder Deluxe column auto HA4915** ex Rob Jones. Registered until Sept next year, it will need a WOF next month, which I will do. Good tyres/brakes and a new carpet.

It does need finishing; door cards and some rubbers need to be fitted along with the sill plates. I estimate that it probably needs another \$2 – 3,000 to finish. It has had new big end bearings and does use a little oil.

I would like it to stay within the Central Group if possible.

Wai Wheels Wheels and Deals Sunday Nov 13 10 till 4 at the Featherston Primary School


