

DASH MATS.....REAR MATS.....FLOOR MATS.....ETC..ETC.ETC.

As most of you are aware the club now has dash mats in stock for sale to members. Although only black ones are readily available please contact me if you desire one in a different colour. Availabilty will be within 48 hours (I hope) of receiving your money and order.

A mould has now been taken of the rear parcel shelf and I will have a mat for view at the December meeting

The cost of both mats will remain at \$40.00 each plus \$5.00 for post/packing etc if required. For prompt delivery please forward your money and desired colour to me.

As your club has invested in these moulds please support this venture. The club owns the moulds and the mats will not be sold to any other person unless purchased through the club.

Eact Fit have offered to supply a very high quality floor mat with the words P 76 embosed in the heel rest. (exact style and wording still under discussion) However as the cost involved in obtaining the embosed heel rest is quite high (they come from Perth) an initial order of 20 sets is required. The cost will be \$50.00 a set and again only available through the club. The price is a wholesale price to members only. (set is front and rear)

Exact Fit have also offered to supply an exact fitting floor carpet (front and rear) with cut outs for the dip switch, seat runners, etc as per original manufacture.

They have assured me the carpets will be of a higher quality than that already available and that they will fit better than those available. However once again due to the high cost of setting up a mould (approx \$1,000) we would need to have about 15 confirmed orders. The cost will be approx \$150.00. (per set) (\$10 for p/p/h)

Please contact me as soon as possible if you wish to place an order for any of the above items. Pending the success of this venture, I hope to be able to arrange for a supply of these items to be available for the National Meet for sale to our interstate members.




