2014 CLASSIC OUTBACK TRIAL

Hi Chris,

2014 Classic Outback Trial

7 days, 3000k total, 1300k competitive all on station tracks and Forrest tracks across outback NSW from Parkes via Ivanhoe, Broken Hill to Remark.

Pre 1985 vehicles, no turbos or 4wheel drives.

It was a fantastic event.

I was in the over 3000cc class which the P76 won by 18 mins.

I finished 9th Outright with over \$1,000,000 worth of cars in the first 8 places.

I drove the car to the event and home with no dents!

We did have some dramas including having to do over 100k competitive with a steering rod bent into the shape of a volcano. The foot brake would jam the wheel against the body which was extra tricky if cornering or sliding and turning the wheel more than 20 degrees would do the same.

We lost a bit of time but on a straight bit I managed to pass a Peugeot 504 at 175 kph.

As we got lost on the very first stage we dropped to 34th on the road so it was a long way back to 9th and very pleasing to be moving up the field every day.

In the last event I had trouble with new rear suspension and with the assistance of rally engineer Gary Kirk had that sorted. However this time I totally stuffed the Koni inserts in the front on Day 1 and had to put up with horrible noises and springs only - kangaroo hopping through the bush.

There were some fabulous cars in the event and the P76 felt very humble alongside others whose commitment was so obviously far greater than mine.

There was a Porsche 911sc, and a 944, a Mustang and a Mercedes and some very fast 10 year later Commodores and a Ford in my class.

The build costs of the first 8 cars are estimated to be above \$1,000,000 and they all have a bigger brave gland than me.

The humble Leyland runs the same engine built for the 1995 Mobil One Around Australia Trail - balanced with a mild cam, big Holley and extractors.

I have run the same engine, gearbox and diff for the 1995 event, the PlayStation Around Australia in 1998, the 2001 Aust Safari Alice Springs to Darwin as the only 2 wheel drive (class winner), 2007 Alice Springs to Gold Coast via Cairns then Birdsville (class winner), and the 2012 Classic Outback Trial (second in class by 6 secs after losing a 3 minute advantage on the second last day due to no brakes at all for 100 k of competitive)!!!!!

It blows a little smoke on startup. Not bad for 6 events, three class wins and a second.

How reliable is that and I can assure you I do wring its neck.

It's a gem and mechanically has never let me down.

The next event is out of Alice Springs for a week in 2016 and I might just lift the head and have a look.

I have put in a hydraulic handbrake for handbrake turns and it works perfectly which over the first few days in the extremely tight Forrest stages came in very handy for any corner of 90 degrees or tighter.

It's fun sliding the beast whether the back wheels are spinning or not.

We use a power steering rack but have never had power to it. I have hurt my right thumb in the last two events (fracturing a small bone in 2012) from bump impact reverse steering shock and now want to fit a full power steering setup.

Anyone got one for sale???

The competitor list and the awesome display of cars in these events is amazing with multiple state and national rally champs ,6 man service crews equipped with everything imaginable, but the dear old Leyland finished one spot behind multiple champ Ross Dunkerton's hot Datsun !

What a buzz!

The car has earnt the respect of other competitors due to reliable fast times with surprise from many that such a big car can be flogged through the tight narrow tracks without damage.

I tell them that it feels small on the inside and it handles the bad stuff so well as it is so well balanced and just loves sliding.

I will get Murray Coote the guru of suspension to build me indestructible front struts and Matt Bryson (an excellent fellow is building me some front struts that he uses in his Peking to Paris winning P76.

Next event I should have suspension, steering, and brakes working all at the same time which will be a first for me.

I just love the car - it's good fun to drive fast in a good handling forgiving car on station tracks day after day. My last rally flat tyre was in 1998 and I only run secondhand tyres and so far have never put a dent in it.

The P76 has given me so much fun I would never change even if I won the lottery and could endurance rally anything.

I am hoping someone out there may be able to help me with a power steering setup and would invite anyone to contact me on 0427-812-013 or by E mail.

To all enthusiasts I applaud you for your good judgment. Stick with it.



I was not aware that the magazine started out as the National ABA before each state edited their own individual one and sharing it with the rest of the states. I have reproduced a couple of editorials from these mags which you may find interesting. The National Magazine then went on to be issued for the National Meetings starting in 1987.

How things have changed since then with communication - emails and internet playing a huge part in keeping the clubs connected. Everything now can be instant. But we still must rely on members submitting articles to keep things interesting.

Welcome to Volume 2, Number 2 of "ANYTHING BUT AVERAGE".




