Thanks to the team who stayed home for the winter to keep club things ticking over in our absence.

Our travels continued, late August, heading for Emerald from Rockhampton, staying at Duaringa and Blackwater along the way. Interesting coal museum there. The coal trains from here to the coast are electric, 250kms plus running day and night and we have trouble running 40 or so Kms down to Seaford, strange isn't it.

Had a few days in Emerald, went out to Lake Maraboon, about 20 kms out, went kayaking for a couple of hours. Time to head south now down to Roma, had a couple of days there, drove out to Mitchell for a dip in the hot springs or bore baths as they call them here. The Big Rig in Roma has a great display of the oil and gas industry in this area.

Jack won the 1954 Redex Trial with the loss of 0 penalty points, quite an achievement. Chinchilla was our next stop. Nice free camp near the weir. Moved on to St George via Dalby and Moonie. Not much there.

Next stop Nindigully Pub, oldest continually licensed Pub in Queensland (1864) had a bit of character and a great free camp. South to Mungindi, hot pools again, too hot for me at 40°C but Di liked it. We thought we had a good camp next to the oval when all these kids started showing up. Little Athletics were having their end of season party and presentation, all quietened down after a couple of hours then rugby training started, all quiet then at 2am the sprinklers came on, gave one side of the van a good wash.

We thought it time to move on, Dirranbandi, nice bakery and camp by the Bollon River. South to Lightning Ridge, opal country though totally different to Coober Pedy, hot pools again, good tourist drives. Went out to the Club in the Scrub at the Grawin Golf course, the Glengarry Hilton and the Sheepyard Inn, all classic little miners drinking holes. I had an email from a bloke a month or 2 ago with an interesting story

Hello Nigel.

It's not really an exciting story, but in1973/4 I worked as a Diecaster for Castalloy at Plympton myself and another man whose surname was Sherwood were chosen to cast the V/8 blocks for the new P76/ motors!

We each cast between 75 to 80 blocks per shift, and because each casting required over 20Kg of molten Alloy, had to keep 3 furnace pots at the go at all times!

Having done this for a few weeks, I was running low one day on ingots to feed my pots! So I asked our supervisor for more!

Half an hour later I received 4 pallets of ingot bars, but on closer inspection, noticed that the stamped code number was different than the previous lots I challenged this with the super, but he came back shortly thereafter, with No! they are just from a different supplier They are fine!

Anyway, having fed them into my furnace pots, and obtaining the right temperature, I poured my first block! As soon as the pour was complete I noticed the alloy at the top of the risers were different than previous! The finished product looked and smelled and acted differently.

I completed my shift and handed over to Sherwood, with my doubt about the alloy! Next day, he agreed with me something was off. We grabbed the supervisor together and he told us to just keep going!

Needless to say, we produced a few hundred of these dubious alloy blocks before we one day were granted the original bar codes again.

I often wondered whatever happened to these dodgy blocks, and did some, or all make it through to a finished engine

I'm still wondering
